

Survey is **Optimistic** & Realistic

It is reassuring that the Economic Survey predicts that the worst is behind us and that we are back in business. Stressing that a stable mandate for the government, backed by strong political will, is key to turning around the economy, the survey outlines labour, capital, land and market reforms to be the engines of growth. It recognises that targeting inflation—along with a stable monetary policy framework—has reduced CPI and stablised the economy.
